1976 CROP & LIVESTOCK SUMMARY

Drought conditions in Los Angeles County during 1976 lowered yields in certain crop categories such as hay, grain, bean, cattle, and apiary products. Nevertheless, gross receipts from farm crops and livestock production increased to \$174,195,300; twenty-one million above the figure reported in 1975. Because of high, off-setting increases in vegetables, nursery stock, and irrigated field crops, the county returns were the highest in the past ten years.

Continuing urbanization brought a reduction in acreage of citrus in the eastern portion of the county. Coupled with lower prices during the later half of 1976, receipts were down over one million dollars. Yields were up in almonds, figs, and apples and with an increase in price in avocados and peaches, the total receipts for other fruits reached \$3,415,000. Strawberry acreage increased only slightly over 1975. Ideal growing conditions, improved cultural practices, and higher prices, however, brought \$4,724,000, a gain of one million dollars over 1975.

Grains, hay, and dry bean plantings dependent upon rainfall experienced a reduction of over one million dollars. Barley acreage harvested for grain was reduced by half over the previous year with the remainder cut as poor quality hay or not harvested at all. Reduced plant growth in the county's rangeland decreased estimated values 30%. Apiary products, another commodity effected by the drought, dropped almost in half to \$383,900 in 1976. A thousand acre increase in alfalfa to 20,865 acres and an increase in price and yield brought growers \$12,363,000.

Despite an increase in acreage, slightly lower yields and a price decrease resulted in only a minor change in returns for sugar beets. Total production in field crop values reached \$16,007,300, an increase of \$2,700,000 over 1975.

An increase of 1,000 acres, along with higher prices, resulted in a gain of six million dollars to the county's vegetable farmers. The county's sweet corn crop produced lower receipts due to less acreage and severe damage by birds. Dry onion acreage was up 500 acres and yields increased, but prices dropped from a record high in 1975. A great volume of Los Angeles County's vegetable production is sold at retail. This is reflected in the large returns to growers from tomatoes, squash, sweet corn, melons, and pumpkins. Total returns to the county's vegetable growers was \$26,632,500, an increase of 21% over 1975.

Gross receipts for 1976 from all categories of nursery stock increased by 17% over the 1975 season. The large dollar increase was due mostly to greater volume of plants being sold out of state and a general price increase in all types of nursery stock.

The total nursery dollar figure for 1976 was \$70,370,000. This is the highest figure ever attained for nursery categories in Los Angeles County. Among the record totals, the leading categories were: ornamental trees and shrubs, \$41,000,000; indoor foliage plants, \$11,531,000; bedding plants, \$6,204,000; and ground crovers, \$4,350,000.

Generally, total livestock and poultry production showed an increase in 1976 over the previous year. Although there was a decrease in fed cattle due to drought and in turkeys, this was more than offset by fryers and milk production both of which were up during 1976. In addition, the higher egg price minimized the effect of fewer eggs produced.

Valuation figures are based on delivery price at the market or on F.O.B. price for commodities shipped out-of-state. All prices have been compared with Federal-State Market News quotations.
