

LOS ANGELES COUNTY CROP REPORT

Our inspectors have made a very careful count of the citrus trees, each in his own district; and a somewhat less thorough one of the other fruit trees, the results of which are given below, with the amount of citrus fruit shipped out of the county for the year ending June 30, 1912, and also for 1913, according to figures of the Citrus Protective League, and approximately the production of other kinds of fruit in the county for 1912:

Bearing orange trees, 2,325,123; fruit shipped, 1912, 3,046,000 boxes fruit shipped; 1913, 2,053,653 boxes.

Bearing lemon trees, 457,139; fruit shipped, 1912, 518,000 boxes; fruit shipped, 1913, 302,400 boxes.

Bearing apples, 95,316 trees, about 110,000 bushels.

Bearing apricots, 203,936 trees, about 180,000 bushels.

Bearing peaches, 407,878 trees, about 275,000 bushels.

Bearing pears, 24,857 trees, about 25,000 bushels.

Bearing plums, 59,882 trees, about 35,000 bushels.

Bearing olives, 144,050 trees, about 500,000 pounds, short crop.

Bearing figs, 13,701 trees, about 200,000 pounds.

Bearing almonds, 64,000 trees, about 57,000 pounds.

Bearing walnuts, 261,926 trees, about 613, 800 pounds.
